We Salute you Darby. The Sunbury Men's Shed is honoured to provide Darby Munro with an Honorary Membership. Darby is a pillar of our community and country. At 93 he is still baking food for the needy. He was orphaned at 10. When World War 2 broke out, at 18 Darby wanted to join the Navy but because he was not too literate an officer filled out his application forms and he was enlisted. He served on the old HMAS Shropshire Warship mostly in the Pacific and throughout the War and fortunately it never took a direct hit. They were renowned for only taking 3 hits to hit their target. One above the target for bearings, one below and the third, a king hit. After the War Darby was given a plot of land as part of a Soldier Settlement and married. His wife died and Darby farmed and raised the 3 children. That's when out of necessity he learnt to cook and is still cooking today at the Sunbury Community Kitchen. He frequently makes bread and butter pudding for the Sunbury Sheddies as well as the community. Darby was presented with a Certificate and 2 pens made by JH to commemorate his time in the Navy.





Cobram Men's Shed: 4 Shed Members and partners made the trip to Cobram in July (braving the zero morning temperatures) at the VMSA Conference to present a cheque for \$500 donation to the Cobram Men's Shed. It was gratefully accepted and acknowledged.

First Aid Certificates: We are still planning to organise First Aid courses.

Our monthly donated Goods Auction is a success and will be a regular feature. Keep an eye out for some bargains on the last Friday of each month.

Shed Opening Times: We are not yet geared up to implement longer Shed opening times but we will make this a priority for the coming new year after the elections in July.

Shed Parking: The Council Community Development Officer and Parking Engineer visited our site and advised us that they had an agreement with some bodies to protect the rare weeds and grass in out driveway. We are awaiting on Council to advise us who these parties are and what the restrictions comprise. Council also advise us that even if we make rearrangements to the car parking, it will not provide parking for a membership growth we are anticipating and advised us to look for a bigger shed. Our position is that we would still like to see if we can fix the current parking problem and in the process of holding talks within the community via our Councillors, Business, State and Federal Parliamentary Representatives to work out a solution. Our Men's Shed is here to stay and will only expand as even more older men in Sunbury realise our existence and what we have to offer in the way of companionship and a meaningful retirement in our latter years.

Shed Security: We have received a Grant from the Sunbury Rotary Club which will cover the increased security that has been needed to upgrade the cameras, install flood lighting and review the monitoring situation to prevent thieves and vandals coming into our grounds and causing havoc. Not only have goods been stolen but there has been damage to fencing and locks and other items. After all, this is our home away from home; it is not nice to be violated. We are installing professional cameras, an alert and alarm system to detect and deter break ins.

Jimmy Moffat's Garage Mods. Over the last month, some Sunbury Sheddies joined forces and modified Jimmy Moffat's Garage so he can work in there in a bit more comfort and his wife Sandra could open the garage door without breaking her back! This involved cutting the garage panel door in half, installing new supports, moving all the spring and hinge mechanisms, installing a remote control opener, making good all the gaps around the doors to stop the weather coming in, putting up some panels on the fixed door, painting everything and making Jim a new work bench. There were a lot of people involved so I won't name them, but they know who they are and we thank them sincerely.

We have some challenges this year as the membership is growing and we have plans for more


activities and new or upgraded machinery.
