

Nat Perri has negotiated for us Io be a Work for the Dole provider, which provides the Shed with income, and gives the participants access to a number of projects and new skills. Our plans are to continue to promote Men's Health through our Men's Shed by providing a venue and training facilities to keep men occupied in both body and mind, particularly in retirement. Currently we are receiving 3 to 4 requests for membership each month and have submitted plans to expand the Shed to accommodate this growing need.



The big night has arrived and our Sheddies help children assemble the cars. Sometimes even the parents are interested and get involved.


