Work for the Dole Program

We are now approaching the end of our first 6 month contract (end April 2017) as a WFD Host Organisation. During this time we have had over 20 job seekers come through the Shed, some for a few days, some for a few weeks and some for several months- and then not to mention some that didn't bother to front at all!

We have also seen a good number of very keen and talented job seekers who have displayed a strong willingness to help and learn. During this period the WFD Jobseekers have carried out a number of tasks and activities around the Shed which would may have not been completed so soon or even undertaken at all, and as such, their efforts are greatly appreciated.

Work for the Dole activities can be hosted by not-forprofit organisations once approved by the Department of Employment. The program gives organisations such as us an extra set of hands to help to undertake activities that would not normally be done. Work for the Dole places job seekers in activities where they can gain skills and experience that give back to the community and can help them find a job.

Our Men's Shed has a massive pool of talented people from all walks of life and trades e.g. carpenters, engineers, ex-metalwork teachers, fitter and turners, electricians, IT specialists and much more, all under one roof. We are ideally placed to provide on-the-job training to local job seekers to assist in developing the skills that employers want; we can assist them in showing prospective employers that they are ready to start work, meet new people and make contacts who can be a referee and get involved in the local community.

There is no other WFD Host Organisation within Sunbury that can offer the diversity in skills training that the Men's Shed has available and can offer. Previously job seekers needed to travel outside of Sunbury to do anything that we offer e.g. Footscray. to improve self-worth and giving purpose to their lives. We have been able to provide on-the-job-training for WFD job seekers, provide for some people with special meeds to undertake tasks that they would normally not have the opportunity to do outside. This begs the question: "Without the Men's Shed where do all these people go?"

How much more and how many more members of the Sunbury community we can continue to benefit and improve their lives into the future will depend on the continuing contribution and efforts of the members of the Men's Shed. Also important is the support of our local community, the support of our local Council, the State and Federal Governments. Combined, we can deliver long lasting benefits for many more members of our community as well as the community as a whole.

The Men's Shed has been asked to continue to be a WFD Host Organisation in Sunbury beyond this current contract. We had hoped and anticipated when we had reached this stage that our new Shed extension would be well progressed and alleviate our workshop crowding. Unfortunately, as a result of the delays and uncertainties around obtaining a building permit, we have regrettably advised the Department of Employment that the Hume Men's Shed (Sunbury) will need to suspend/ halt been a WFD Host Organisation until such time as if and when our new shed extension is complete.

If the Men's Shed continues to be a WFD Host Organisation we would have the opportunity to continue to train many more local jobseekers and hopefully help them gain employment. Having the new Shed extension would allow us to cater for and accommodate more WFD job seekers on an on-going basis in a safer working space. This creates new opportunities for WFD job seekers and the Men's Shed where we can work in partnership with local community organisations to undertake community projects. Partnerships can also be formed with Hume City Council and State and Federal Governments with the primary objective been to benefit local WFD job seekers, the Sunbury community and in turn the Men's Shed ... a "Win-Win" situation!

It has been shown and proven since the conception of the Hume Men's Shed Sunbury that we can and do provide a significant benefit to many and varied members of the Sunbury community e.g. support the health and well-being of all men, maintain or improve their physical, mental and social health, productivity, opportunity



Hume Sunbury Men's Shed is still waiting on Council to provide guidance with how we are to progress with our required extension. Nat Perri has provided options for parking within our boundary and outside and Scott Trembath on behalf of the Council is dealing with it. Scott visited the Shed on 18 January, discussed our current status, was shown the parking issues and options and will report back.

SunFest have requested Sunbury Men's Shed assemble the dance floor once more as well as assemble some marquees for the coming festival for which they will provide us with a grant similarly to last year.




