

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## Street pantry for the needy



In September a group of young students from Kolbe Catholic College in Greenvale received an award from the Corporal Cameron Baird VC MG Grant, for their project as part of The Plan for the Planet Program.

Their project is to essentially provide for those living in hard conditions in the City of Hume who may sometimes go without food for themselves and their families. Additionally, they want to allow those who can afford to share excess food, to have the opportunity to leave food in a convenient location.

The Group contacted HMSS, and after a visit and tour around our site, we agreed to manufacture the Roadside Pantry which you see in the attached photo. Boxes or crates of food will be left on the shelves for anyone to help themselves to as much as they need,

Their original design had a simple wire mesh on the doors, but this was later changed to Perspex sheet to help keep out the weather.

Much of the construction is from stock or recycled material, and much credit must go to Fred Parnis and Peter Wilkinson for the manufacture and design modifications as the project went along.

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


