

First Aid Certificates: Plans are still underway to organise First Aid courses. There are approximately 10 people who are seeking to complete the course.

Plasma cutter. As part of the Vic Government Grant we have purchased a plasma cutter for the sheetmetal men and anyone who is interested to cut metal including profiles of anything imaginable. Examples in pictures below. First job is to make some letterings for the Shed.

Fox Classic Car Museum . Another session for members to visit the Fox Museum has been organised by Alan Dwyer, a volunteer at the Museum. Special admission to our members is \$5.00.

Bunnings request to the Shed On 1 September, the day before Fathers Day this year, Bunnings asked the Shed members to perform a toy assembly exercise *similar to what we did a couple of years ago*. The Shed members make "kits" of a car and a truck, pre-cut, pre-drilled with jigs to make sure they can be assembled accurately. The children "make" the toys with the help of "Sheddies". This year we are also going to have a "kit" for a small tool box that is ideal to give Dad to carry tools around in when doing minor repairs around the house.

The Shed needs to be represented at more Field days like SunFest and markets.

Our Shed has been requested by the Victorian Men's Shed Association to host the next NW Region Men's Shed meeting. We have also been requested to develop an OH&S schedule, procedure and policy for all Sheds in Victoria.

The Shed is working towards having a preferred buyer list based on economy and other considerations.

Sick members to be identified and contacted on a regular basis. We are looking at asking wives or next of kin to advise the Shed if a member is sick and going to be away for any length of time.

Shed Shirts and Hats. This issue is being investigated with a view to seeking sponsorship or a discount. A list will be placed on the Notice Board for interested members.

Our Security System is being upgraded to high quality cameras and lighting. Members will install them and Calco will integrate them into our present system and commission them.

The Members are now permitted to use the Cottage anytime with the proviso that we vacate it if it is booked at any time.

The Shed now comes under the auspices of the Environment Department of the Hume Council




