 - a. OFFERED FOR SALE TO THE PUBLIC (E.G. GARAGE SALE)
 - b. OFFERED FOR SALE TO MEMBERS (A DESIGNATED AREA)
 - c. OFFERED FOR FREE TO MEMBERS (A DESIGNATED AREA)
- 4. ALL MACHINERY USE AND SHED MATERIAL ON PERSONAL JOBS MUST BE APPROVED BY A SECTION COORDINATOR

Any situation outside of these constraints can be decided by Shed management (committee or section coordinator) at the time it arises.


