Approved with a budget of \$1500

- Business case for new desktop; Currently we are using an old desktop which was originally used by the members in the meeting room. Since transferring the computer to the office the workload on the computer has substantially increased. We use the computer for the database as well as editing photos for members identification. The computer is frequently used offsite via Team Viewer by Albert and Ian. The computer is now very slow especially when used offsite. Albert uses the computer offsite on a regular basis including whilst at his holiday house in Phillip Island. At Phillip Island Albert's personal mobile data is used to access the Shed Computer and this naturally also slows down the data transfer.
- 10/ Soil for back garden. Barry Burbridge requires 6 metres of soil @\$70 per metre from Sunbury sand and soil.
- Ted to investigate free soil otherwise quote to be obtained from Roscoes. Purchase approved if unable to source free soil.

Business case for soil. The soil in the garden beds have substantially sunk. We will try and obtain free soil but worst case scenario is total cost of 6 metres.

11 members of the shed plus an employee of Compassion North attended the 2 day seminar on Mental Health First Aid.

Joan Broughan and Lynette Kinder from MH Key consultants conducted the 2 day course.

The shed received a \$4600 grant to present the course. This included the cost of the presenters, morning and afternoon teas as well as lunch. We were also able to purchase whiteboards to assist the presenters with their presentation. The grant was provided through the Australian Mens Shed Association as part of the australian government department of health national Shed Development Program.

All members of the shed were invited to participate in the course.

The course received very positive feedback from all the participants. It gave them the tools to recognise mental health issues and how we can assist and identify people with mental health issues.

After the course the participants were invited to complete a questionnaire that enabled them to obtain a certificate. they were also presented with a manual. A copy of the manual is in the Shed library.
