President Report

August 2022

One month down

It is very pleasing to see the members embrace the voluntary Covid initiatives keep up the good work. At this stage the intention is not to provide Friday lunch until the end of August, this will be reviewed on a monthly basis.

Given the ever-increasing increase in the number of Covid 19 cases and the introduction of the Monkey Pox Virus, the possibility of lock downs cannot be ignored. The Shed's reserve funds will see us through any such eventuality comfortably. These reserve funds are there for such events but also provide the ability to make improvements to the Shed's capabilities, if you believe that something is needed in this space please bring it to the attention of the committee, a business case sighting the estimated cost and advantages should be provided with this communication.

We are manning a display at Bunnings prior to Father's Day, Rob and Billy are preparing items to take down for interaction with the many expected visitors. Volunteers are always welcome.

The wood working items donated by the College are being prepared for sale, the quality of the items is very high and a credit to the colleges wood working section and students. Have a look at what's there you may feel the need to purchase something.

The Panic Buttons and speaker installation is progressing well, we are also looking at the ability to control the security system and cameras remotely. This will provide the ability to end the paid Remote Monitoring of the security system and provide a good saving. As part of this project an additional security camera is being installed and an older lower resolution camera is being replaced.

A test of the installed speakers has identified several issues, as a result the speaker in the main machinery area is being upgraded with an additional unit to be installed in the garden area. The speaker being upgraded will be relocated to the



kitchen area. Given the lack of reaction of members during testing I can only hope the response to an actual emergency will result in some activity.

A number of committee members are attending the Community Enterprise Grant Relaunch late August, as well as renewing contacts with other groups there is an opportunity to secure a new Defibrillator at no cost from the organizers. We are expecting a Grant to replace the existing aging unit, even if successful the opportunity to have multiple units distributed through the shed is a great safety initiative.

Garry and Andrew have been busy reactivating the area initially set aside for the assembly of the children's tables and chairs; this will greatly enhance Gary's already substantial contributions to the shed's bottom line.

The installation of fixed hose reels for the garden is progressing thanks to Kevin's efforts and is expected to be completed by the time this article is published.

Investigations into increasing the capacity of the rear carpark are also underway. Given the complications and cost of this exercise combined with the technical issues this project will only be implemented if there is a benefit to the members.

CONDENSED MINUTES REPORT

Correspondence

22 pieces of correspondence were dealt with

General Business

1/ Move back fence to allow additional parking. The back fence was put in place when the shed started. It was moved back approx. 2 metres to avoid the drains and possible a main telecommunication pipeline, coupled with needing permission from VicRail. If the fence was moved we could park an additional 8 cars in the back by also moving a couple of the garden beds to the new fence line. The best option is to approach City of Hume to shift the fence.

2/ Assist other organization with Bunnings Sausage sizzle

Suggestion declined, shed is willing to do sausage sizzle at short notice

3 . Need to know what is the shed's maximum limit on savings.

The minimum liquid cash limit on savings is \$100,000 plus CPI, after this limit is reached more flexible spending can be made for non-essential items such as trips and subsidized meals etc

4. The shed is registered with the ACNC as a non for profit organization.

6 . We need to get more members involved in projects or assist , or in keeping the shed clean and tidy and organised. Notices in Newsletter and around the shed reminding members to clean up after themselves.

7. Future of the 'Shopsmith' machine that's being/been restored. Has the shed got to keep it, or should we maybe donate it to another "needy" shed? Good PR?

The item was donated on the proviso it is kept in Sunbury. Offer it to the Sunbury Mens Shed and to members of the shed

8. Suggest purchase of (2) new cordless drills for the electrical/metal sections. The AEG batteries seem ok, but the one drill is pretty much worn out. Maybe just buy skins? Total cost \$358 approved

9. Suggest investigating upgrading the existing shed lighting to more efficient and brighter LED lights

Albert to investigate LED replacements in workshop and Kevin to be approached on his suggestion for better lighting.

10. Review the 'five year plan'

5 Year plan to have more details on items.

11. Rather than doing a Friday lunch, on a nice day, why not do mid-morning outdoor (more Covid compliant?) sausage in bread or bacon & egg sanga? Noted and will be encouraged

10/ Alarm Upgrade and Panic Button Upgrade

Alarm remote Monitoring Module full upgrade \$1070

Camera remote monitoring \$180

Replace camera and new camera for welding area \$706

EVAC Upgrade to 250W \$1150

Garden Speaker \$130

Total cost \$3236

Currently we pay Nivek Alarm systems \$144 per quarter (\$576 PA) to monitor the alarm. To monitor ourselves is \$1070 (\$973 NO GST) to set up then only cost is an sms. Insurance wise there is no difference as advised by Milton

12/ Improved communications internal and external. i.e. within the committee, the shed general members and to external contacts.

Recommend that president recommences weekly talks to members. Look at bringing Facebook under shed control

13/ Clean-up of overhead storage racks. Is there a program or do we need a working bee or similar.

Have a cleanup day and warn members to see a committee member if they want to keep any material. To be done on a needs basis

14/ Kitchen / general area. On 5 year plan for kitchen to be completed by 2025. Needs attention sooner.

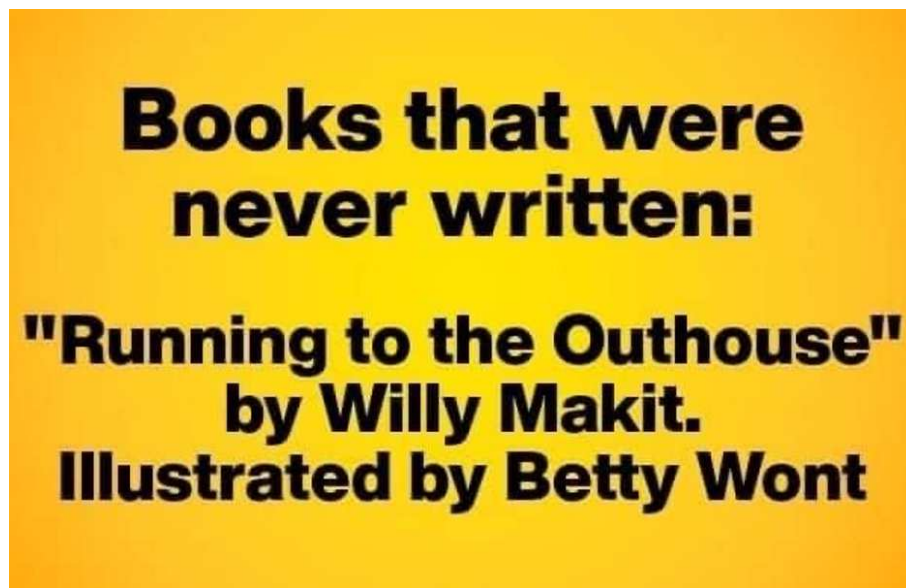
Appeal for a kitchen coordinator to ascertain what is required in the kitchen area.
