Mike joined the shed in March 2012 and subsequently joined the committee in June 2012. It was quite obvious from the start that during the meetings, if Mike made any comments regarding issues raised that you had to give careful thought before you responded, because Mike was always close to the mark in the direction we should take.

Up to the Covid restriction we had lunch every Friday and Mike's speciality was a big pot of pea and ham soup.

For several years Mike was the membership chairman and assistant treasurer. He coordinated with Lyn Rayner from Bunnings and managed to get quite a few sausage sizzles for the shed. He arranged the rosters and encouraged members to participate on the day.

In 2018 Mike became president of the shed and initiated a welfare sub-committee. Guest speakers became a regular feature of the shed covering men's general health and mental health.

His biggest highlight was when the House of Wellness approached the shed to do a story on mens health, Mike was interviewed at the shed by their film crew and did a 3 minute video on the shed and its activities. This was shown on prime time television. So successful was this video that it was taken up by the Government to promote Men's Sheds in Victoria.

Mike also did a couple of radio interviews with Gerard Mansover, the Commissioner for Senior Victoria.

Mike oversaw the upgrade of the shed from a storage shed to a workshop facility including a new toilet block.

In January the first case of Covid hit and in March the shed was ordered to close its doors for 10 weeks. This went on and off for the next 2 years.

Although Mike had never done a trade, he fitted in well making whirligigs, bird boxes and asia minor traps.

Mike handed over an improved shed to Ted Riley in July 2020 after being president for 2 years.

Mike remained on the committee until June 2022, always ready to help.

He will be sadly missed by his family and friends and members of the shed.







REGENERATE ENGINEERING



The Shed had a new energy saving hot water service installed under the Government Energy program. The unit and installation came as no charge to the shed.




