# A little trip that Stephen King and his wife Made to the high country



Returning from a alpine high country trip I called into a couple of mens sheds, Mt Beauty shed was unfortunately closed on Monday's, but Bright United Mens Shed (BUMS) was open on the Tuesday morning.

I was met by the president (Kevin) who showed me around, it was pretty early so there were only a few guys present while I was there.

The shed was custom built by the members on council leased land (30 years) and is shared with a once a week ladies afternoon group and a U3A group who have their own container for their storage.

The shed is surprisingly large inside, has an upstairs large meeting room with a commercial grade kitchen and a full length mezzanine floor area.


Ground level has a small kitchen/tea room and a bar fridge (yes, they are licensed!) toilet's and shower etc.

The workshop main area has a car hoist and woodworking machines, under the mezzanine floor is a welding shop with mig and tig etc. and a wood turning room with four lathes, on the other side of the shed is a metal machining shop with a Bridgeport and smaller milling machine, a lathe, surface grinder, cutter grinder and drill presses.


Outside there is a forge and the U3A container.

On the mezzanine floor there are two clean rooms, the first has a 3D printer, programming etc. and the second a CNC router and laser cutter/engraver. There are 40 odd members with approximately 40% being under 40 years old. I would highly recommend other members call into sheds that you see on your journeys, it's always good to see what they are doing and how they operate.
