

It is Membership renewal and AGM time again and to date there is still 36 existing member who have not renewed their membership so please respond to Albert's email ASAP.


The AGM will be held on the 16th July so make sure that date is in your diary.

Metro Train Excursion 6th May


Following the very informative presentation by Matt from Metro Trains a few weeks ago organized by Peter C. which educated many of us on utilizing the PTV app., safe places on the station platform, the Myki card for Seniors etc. we were invited to go on an escorted excursion to the Metro tunnel information centre in the city.

This excursion was co-ordinated for Tuesday 6th May, and 22 members participated.

Matt met us at the Sunbury station showed us the Safe Zones and helped any members unsure of using their Myki card to board the Metro train to Flinders Street station.

We were then taken to the Information Booth and Travellers Aid room which provides a range of assistance to including connection assistance, participation assistance for those with disabilities, showers, crisis travel, travellers aid lounge and more. With a few days' notice they can also assist with a volunteer companion the take you to a connecting service or even medical appointments. Matt then walked the group to the Metro Tunnel information centre which is normally open to the public but was temporarily closed so that our group could listen to and question the three presenters on the new larger trains, five new stations and the technology involved. The updated system is due to open around the end of 2025.
